- Lynchburg advanced into the Sweet 16 for the third time in the last four seasons with 1-0 wins last weekend over Maryville College (TN) and Roanoke College.

- The Hornets have out-scored opponents 84-5 on the season, and have recorded seven-straight shutouts. The Hornets have also posted seven straight wins and have only lost twice since September 9.

- Freshman forward Betsy Kwiatkowski leads the LC offense with 21 goals (seven game-winners) and 10 assists for 52 points on the season. She earned first-team All-Old Dominion Athletic Conference, as did senior defender Lauren Askey. Askey, also the conference women's soccer scholar-athlete of the year, anchors a Hornet defense that has allowed just five goals.

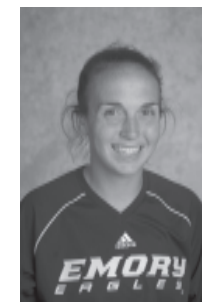
- The #11 ranked Emory University Eagles advanced into the Sweet 16 with a bye in the first round and a 1-0 win over Hardin-Simmons University.

- The Eagles went undefeated 12 straight matches to start the season, including a 1-0 victory over Lynchburg in overtime, and have won five of their last last seven contests.

- The Eagle offense is led by senior forward Jamie English who scored 10 goals and assisted on five others. Joyce Lam is second on the team in points while contributing five goals and helping on 11 more. The defense has allowed only eight goals in 19 games and is anchored by junior defender Grace Lam. Grace has also made an impact on the offensive side of the ball with four goals.

- The #10 nationally ranked Bears of Washington University come in to today's game after defeating Denison University 3-0 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

- The Bears won 10 straight to open the season and have won seven of their last 10 matches. They posted a 5-2 record in the University Athletic Association en route to winning the conference title. Washington lost 2-3 in OT to fellow regional participant Emory University.

- The offense is led by sophomore forward Caryn Rosoff who has posted 10 goals and eight assists for 28 points. Opponents have been stymied by the outstanding goalie play of Carrie Sear. She has posted four shutouts while allowing just 13 goals in 20 games and recording 52 saves.

- The Lions have won 14 straight matches since their lone tie on September 19. In that stretch they have only given up three goals and scored 56.

- TCNJ's explosive offense is led by three outstanding goal producers. Dana DiBruno has posted 13 goals and seven assists, Jamie Kunkel has 17 goals and six assists, and Briann McDonough has tallied 10 goals and 12 assists. The stingy defense that has allowed just four goals is led by Courtney Krol, who has also been a valuable offensive weapon, having scored four goals with seven assists.
