

## Virginia Community College Guaranteed Admissions Agreement

### SUGGESTED Curriculum Guide –

#### *Economic Crime Prevention & Investigation Major*

In 2007, Lynchburg College (LC) and the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) signed a guaranteed admissions agreement. Under the agreement, students with a qualifying degree program who have a grade point average of 2.0 or higher are eligible for guaranteed admission to the College. Students will also have fulfilled LC's general education requirements except for the intermediate foreign language requirement and a two-semester-hour Senior Symposium course. Below is a plan for completion of a degree in Economic Crime Prevention & Investigation for students eligible for guaranteed admission enrolled full-time at LC.

This schedule is based on students having completed the following courses, with grades of C or better, before enrolling at Lynchburg College: Accounting I and II or Principles of Accounting I and II (**ACC 111-112, ACC 211-212**), Principles of Economics-Macro and Principles of Economics-Micro (**ECO 201-202**), Business Statistics I (**BUS 221**).

While not all students will take all the courses in their major in exactly the same sequence, the guide below can be used in combination with the on-line graduation progress report as a pathway to degree completion. See the Academic Regulations in the Lynchburg College Catalogue for all academic degree requirements. Students should consult their major advisor for guidance specific to the student's needs and interests.

Courses in bold can be taken at Virginia Community Colleges or LC. If students take these courses as part of their associate's degree, they do not need to retake them at Lynchburg College. Students may transfer a maximum of 76 credit hours to the College. They must take a minimum of 48 credit hours at LC, and must have a total of 124 credit hours to earn the bachelor's degree.
