

Virginia Community College Guaranteed Admissions Agreement

Suggested Curriculum Guide –*Psychology Major*

In 2007, Lynchburg College (LC) and the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) signed a guaranteed admissions agreement. Under the agreement, students with a transfer-oriented degree program who have a grade point average of 2.0 or higher are eligible for guaranteed transfer of up to 76 credit hours. Such degrees will fulfill LC's general education requirement except for three semester hours of a foreign language and a two-semester-hour Senior Symposium course. Below is a plan for completion of a degree in theatre for students eligible for guaranteed admission enrolled full-time at LC.

Students must have completed the following courses before enrolling at Lynchburg College:
Introduction to Psychology I and II (PSY 200 or 201 and 202) with grades of C or better.

While not all students will take all the courses in their major in exactly the same sequence, the guide below can be used in combination with the on-line graduation progress report as a pathway to degree completion. See the Academic Regulations in the Lynchburg College Catalogue for all academic degree requirements. Students should consult with their major advisor for guidance specific to their needs and interests.

The bolded courses are offered at Virginia Community Colleges. If students take these courses as part of their associate's degree, they do not need to retake them at Lynchburg College. However, students must take a minimum of 48 credit hours at LC, and must have a total of 124 credit hours to earn the bachelor's degree.
