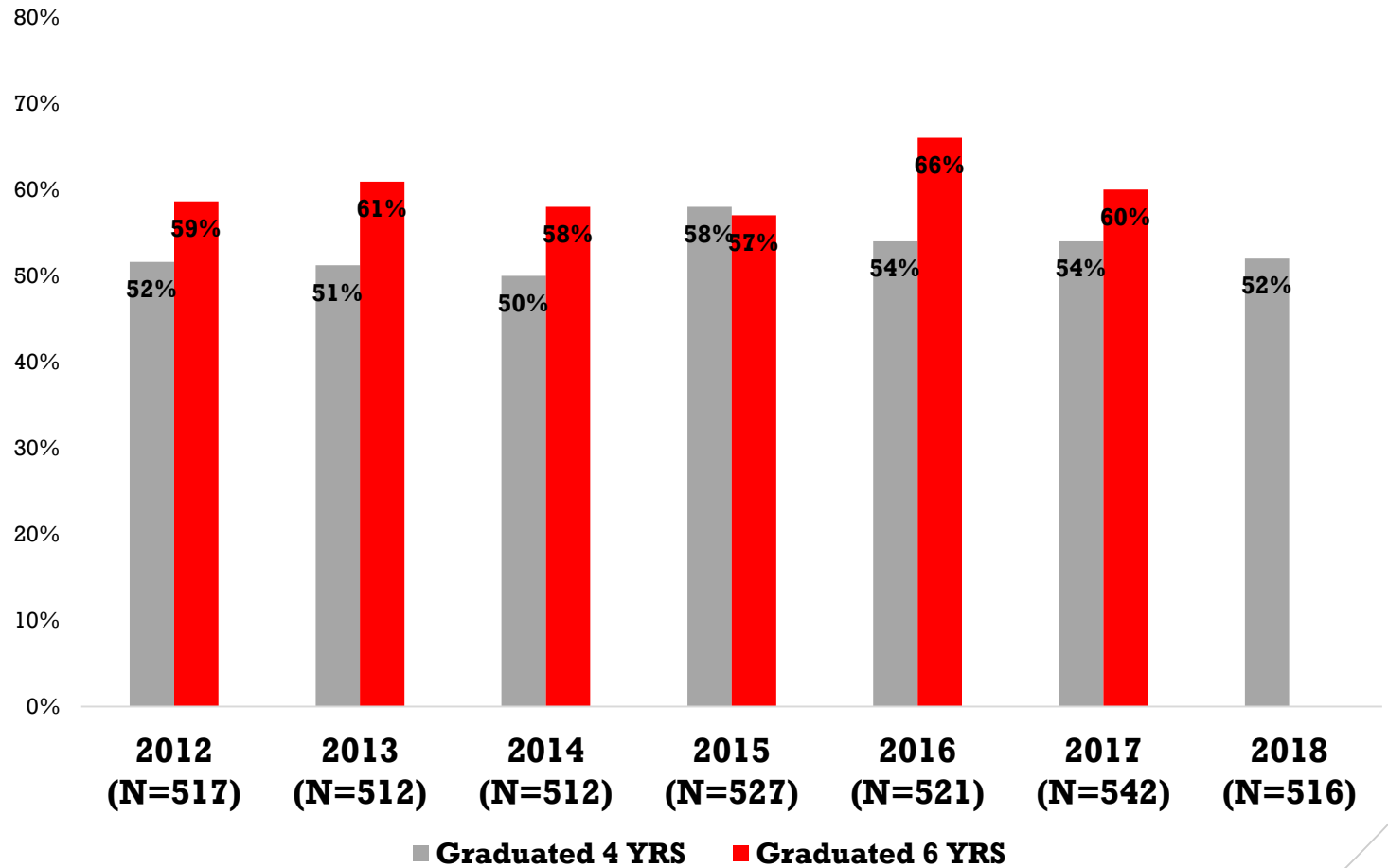
University of Lynchburg Cohort Graduation Rates

## Student Right to Know Graduation Rates

- This report contains summary information about graduation rates for the following student groups:
  - Fall cohort defined as first time in college students, including six-year graduation rates for those students based on race/ethnicity and gender.
  - Students who were eligible for federal Pell Grants.
    - The Pell Grant is a federal grant awarded to students who meet specific income and financial need criteria.
    - Often, the percentage of Pell Grant students is a proxy for an institution's ability to address access by lower income students.
  - First-generation college students which are defined as students whose parents did not *graduate* from college.
  - Comparison graduation rates are presented based upon financial aid type:
    - Pell Grant recipients
    - Subsidized student loan recipients (no Pell Grants received)
    - Neither Pell Grants nor subsidized loans received

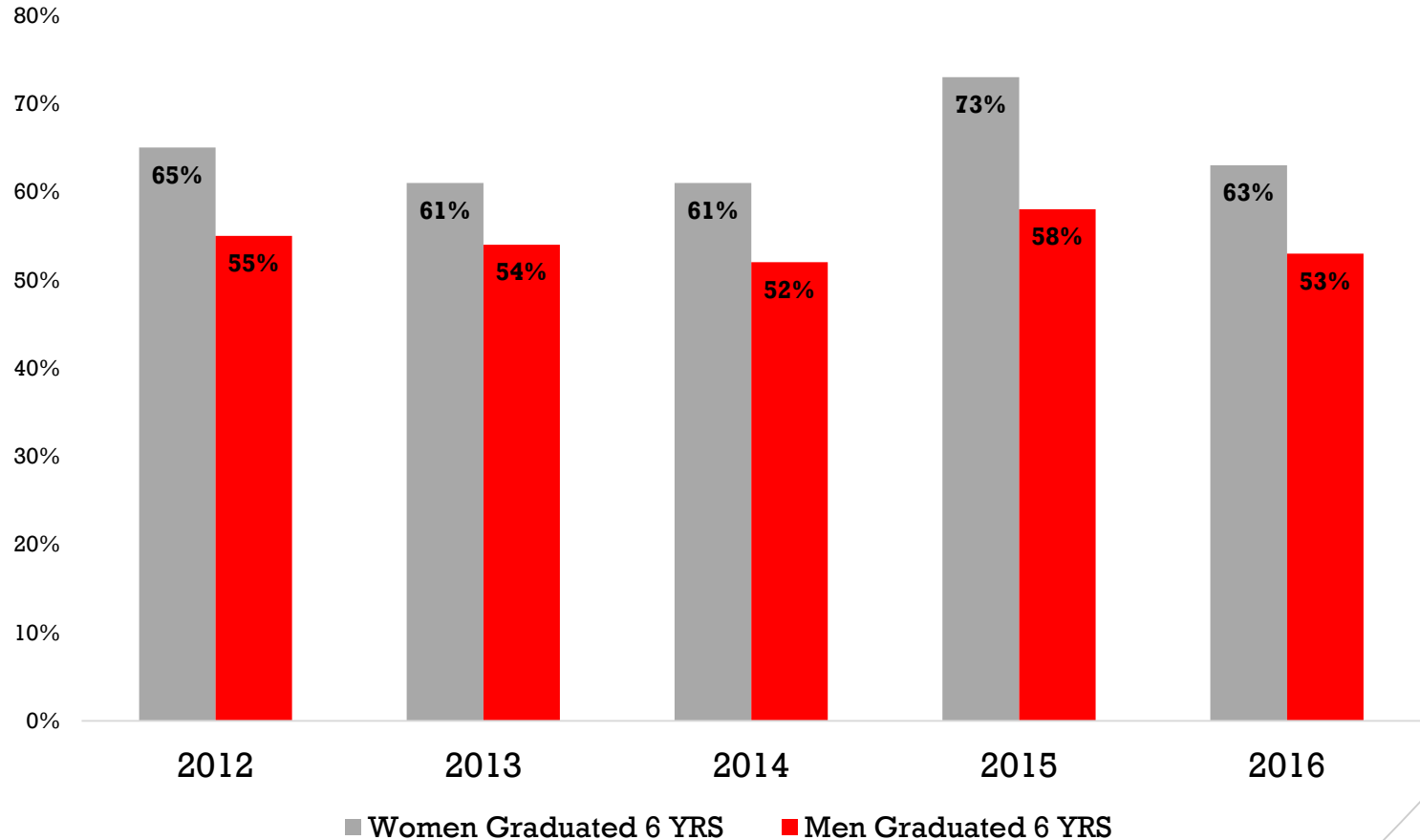
# Cohort Graduation Rates 2012-2018

## Graduation Rates: Fall Cohorts



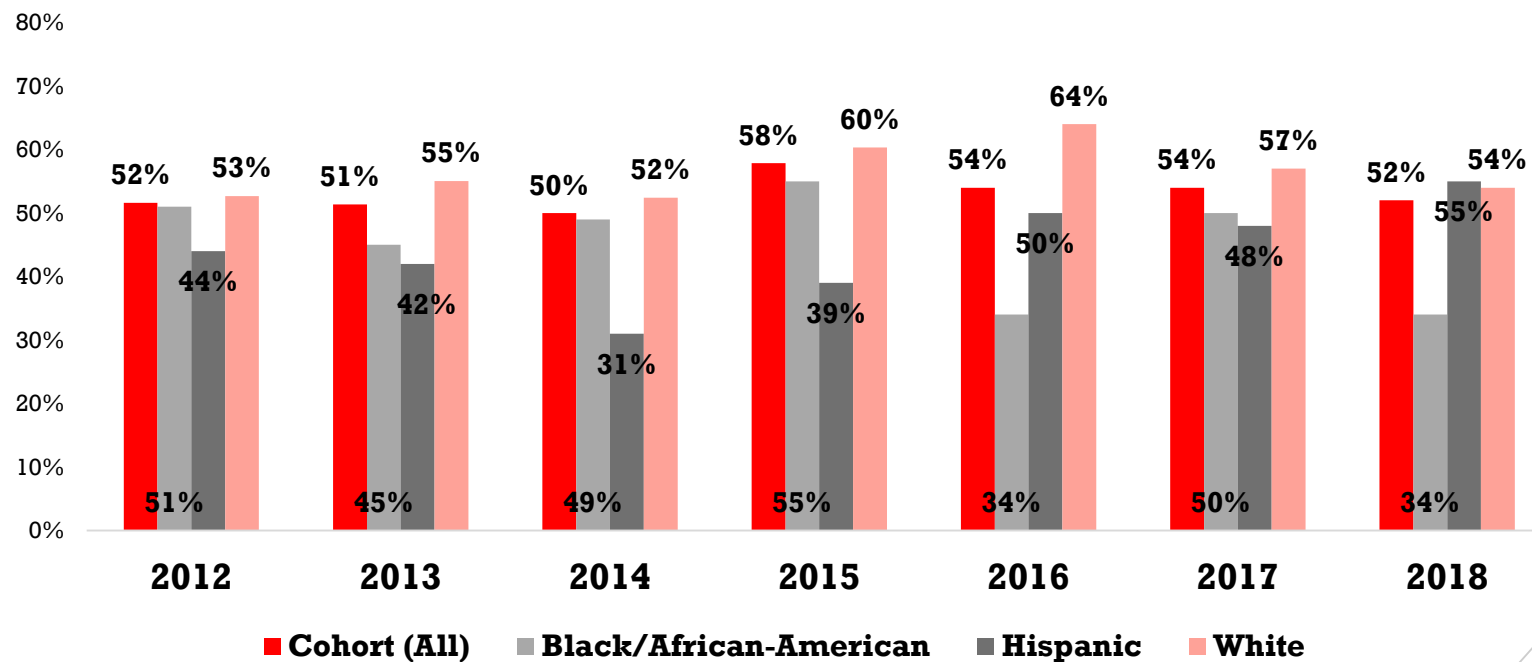

**Graduation Rates: Gender**



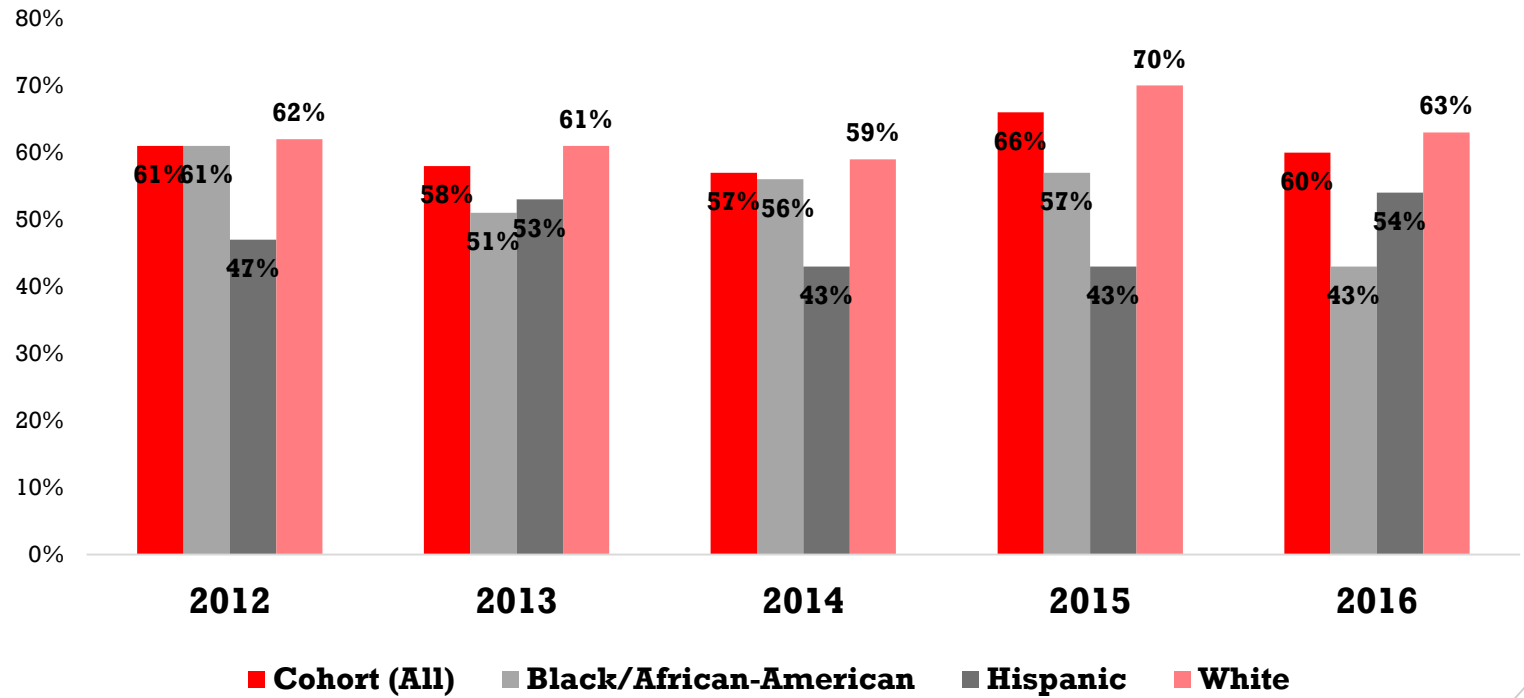
# Four Year Cohort Graduation Rates Race and Ethnicity

## Four Year Graduation Rates: Race/Ethnicity



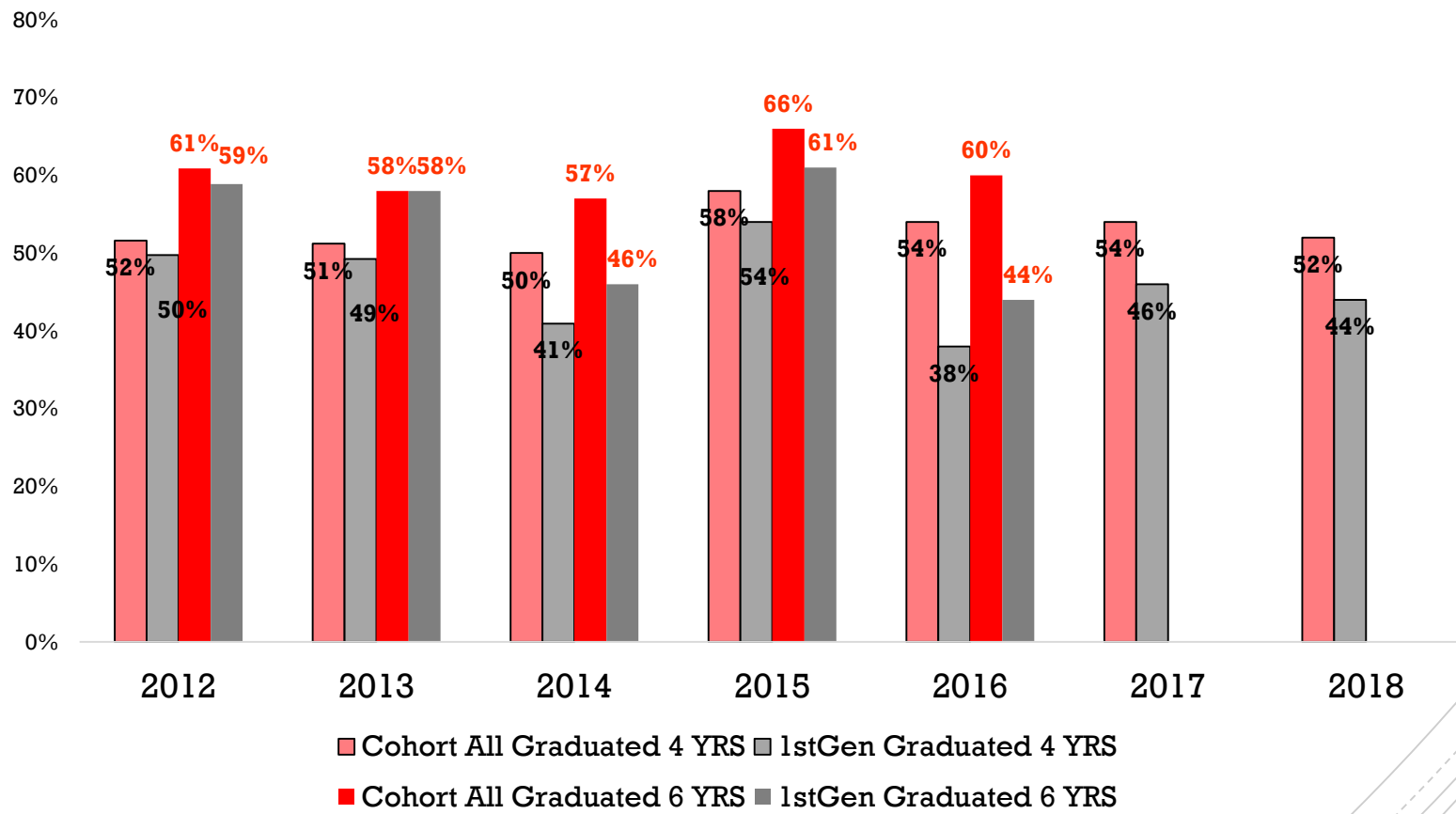
# Six Year Cohort Graduation Rates Race and Ethnicity

## Six Year Graduation Rates: Race/Ethnicity



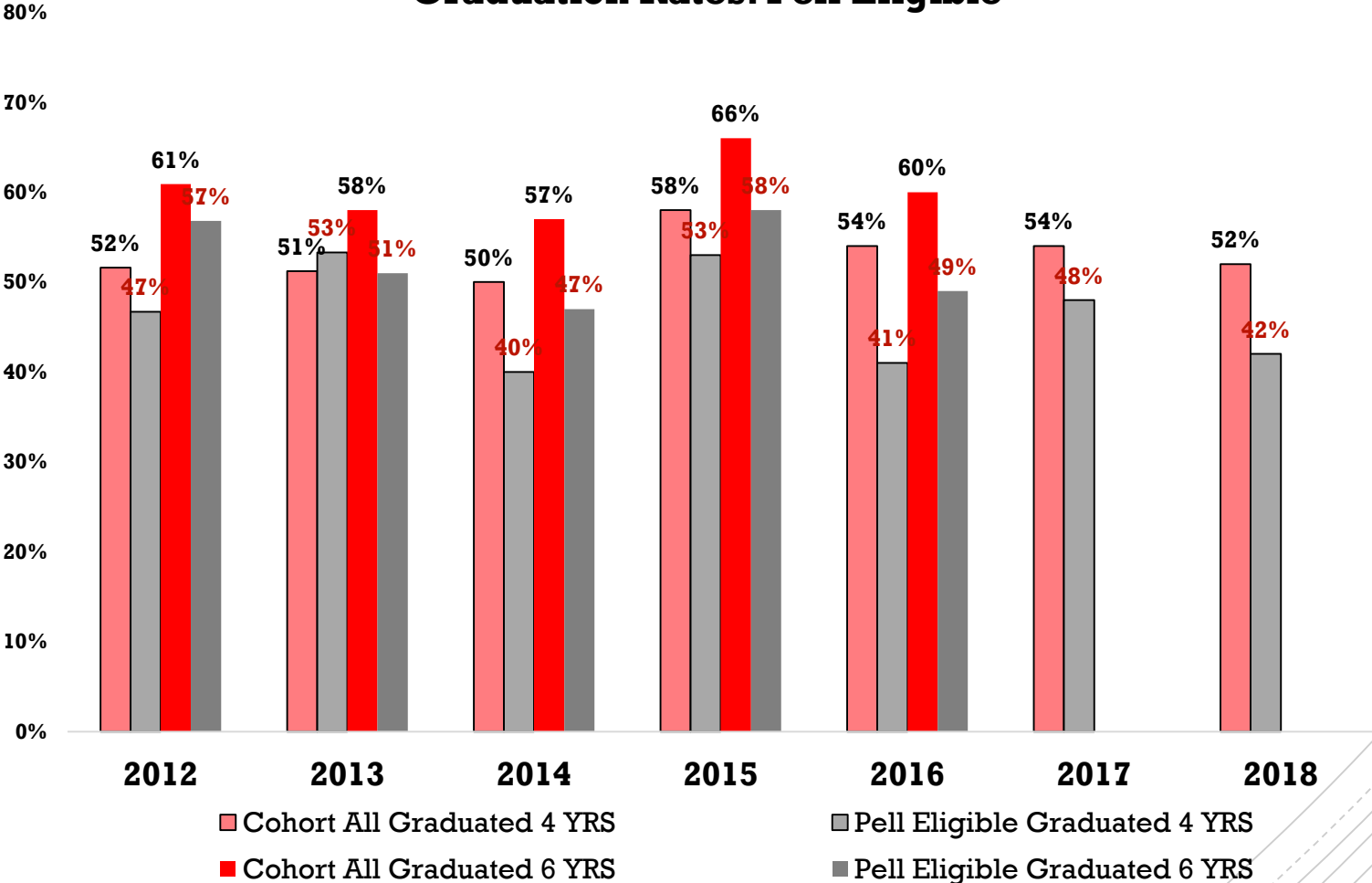
