A LOOK AT THE ETHICS BOWL TEAM

This past Sunday and Monday, the University of Lynchburg Ethics Bowl team competed at Roanoke College against 15 other Virginia private schools. Westover students Jeremy Webb, Bea Kelly-Russo, Jack Schroder, Richard Bruster, and Senior and Captain Mary King, are all members of the 9 person team led by Westover Professor Dr. Kicklighter. In this competition, schools battled head to head arguing their stance on cases concerning Ethics and Social Justice. Upon being given a case, a team has 6 minutes to formulate their stance, 5 minutes to present it, and the opportunity to ask questions to the opposing team. They are then given a score by the judges, and the teams with the top 2 scores after 4 cases compete in the final round.

Students on this team get no extra credit for the practice they put in 2 times a week or the competitions that take up whole weekends, but do so voluntarily. When asked why she chose to make this commitment, Sophomore Bea Kelly-Russo explained how it helps her to see other people's perspectives and get an in-depth look at current events. She feels that it forces her to think quick on her feet and build oral presentation skills.

Dr. Kicklighter, who leads the team's practice sessions, explains how Ethics Bowl is a great way for students and professors to get to know each other outside of the classroom. She points out that the team works really hard and did well in this past weekends tournament.

The team is now looking to its next competition in April at the University of South Alabama where they will compete in a similar tournament where the theme will be Bioethics.
